WRITING

There are ten points for this question. Pupils are not expected to produce faultless English. To achieve ten points, a pupil should write a cohesive text which successfully communicates all three parts of the message:

1. how long he/she will stay
2. what he/she would like to do
3. what kind of food he/she likes

Points	Criteria
10-9	<u>All three parts of message clearly communicated.</u> Only minor spelling or grammatical errors.
8-7	<u>All three parts of message communicated.</u> Occasional errors in spelling and/or grammar.
6-5	<u>All three parts of the message attempted.</u> Expression requires interpretation by the reader.
4-3	<u>Only two parts of the message communicated.</u> Some errors in spelling and grammar. The errors in expression may require patience and interpretation by the reader.
2-1	<u>Only one part of the message communicated.</u>
0	<u>Question unattempted or totally incomprehensible response.</u>

Pupils are not penalised if they write more than 35 words. If pupils use less than 25 words, they automatically lose one point.
